About 'Bama Speaks'

Rachael Goolsby and Amanda Cordiva say: 'It was very important that the kids make their own piece. It started during our school's "Dance and Theater Week" with Cucalorus resident artist Jen Ray, from Vancouver, Canada. She joyfully worked on the topic of barriers and created a pathway for the children to follow, but encouraged them to be creative within those bounds. This moved to making a performance piece through exercises such as physical character work, and learning how to be an attentive audience member. Building blocks began to form as the children performed and watched each other. The children spoke about artwork they painted with the topic of borders & territory and what those words meant to them.'

Samantha Herrick, director of the Community Arts Center, worked with the summer camp kids on a thematically fitting film which will be part of the 'Bama Speaks' program as well.



'We will continue the SARUS youth program, inviting other schools and youth groups or individuals to join our project with the goal of creating meaningful pieces for young and old, during the SARUS Festival this year and in years to come.' Karola Luttringhaus says. 'I think we should listen to how children perceive the world, what they see is working well and what some of the problems are. I believe that we can learn from their relatively uninhibited view and their willingness to speak the truth as they perceive it.
